



Title One Program

Title One is a federally funded program designed to help students strengthen their reading skills through targeted, research-based interventions. All students take benchmark assessments three times a year (NWEA MAP) to evaluate their reading progress. If a student's score falls below grade level, additional assessments are completed to determine if they qualify for Title One reading support.

How do I know if my child is receiving Title One Support? If your child qualifies for Title One support, one of the Title One specialists will contact you to share your child's assessment data and discuss their specific needs. Your child will only begin receiving services with your permission.

What will my child be learning in Title One?

Depending on your child's grade level, they will receive research-based instruction personalized to fit their reading needs.

How will I be notified of my child's progress in Title One? Your child's progress is shared in their online tracker, which is updated weekly or bi-weekly so you can see the steps they're taking toward their goal. We also connect with families often to build a strong partnership around your child's learning and progress. (Set your preferred ways to stay in touch.)
